

- Molly informs us that Sam, our Rotary Exchange Student from Italy is moving from her house to the Francis' home.


## **Gene Taps Outstanding Speaker**


### **Interact Student Report**

### **JOE'S VIETNAM STORY**



Joe's story was featured on Public Television KVIE



Joe shows his 18 KaratGold bracelet which he was issued to use to trade for his life in the event of capture by the enemy.

Rotarian Joe Scheimer kept us on the edge of our seats as he told his story of being code name "Raven 42," dressed in civilian clothes, and dropped behind enemy lines in Laos. He was Squadron Commander of a secret mission to help our Air Force in bombing Laos and Vietnam. If he ever got caught, the US Govt. would disavow any knowledge of him. He was issued a fake passport and given a bracelet for ransom. He was to tell the enemy that he was just a forest ranger looking for fires. The Vietnam conflict was unnecessary, lasting 30 years, thru 5 American Presidents, with 58,000 American Troop Casualties.
