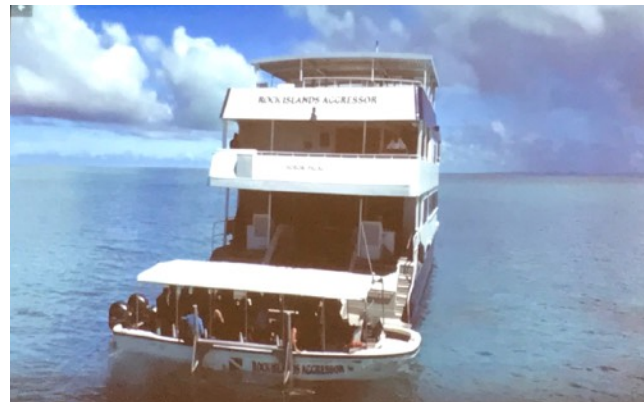

## Dan Dives With Sharks



*Fifteen divers shared "Rock Islands Aggressor" for 7 days at sea.*

Having recently visited Palau, one of the most beautiful diving venues in the world, Dan opts to narrate a promotional video, rather than attempt to describe his experience with words.

During this 7-day trip, 15 divers (mostly

from Solano County) took 25 dives in 84 degree waters—a far cry from the 60 degree waters in our region.

Surprisingly, while diving, it was not the sharks that were aggressive, but the mating Bump Head Parrot Fish, which needed to be

avoided. They enjoyed riding strong Pacific currents, and also being tethered while watching sea life pass them in the strong currents. Dan found this \$6,000 experience well

worth it—giving Dan valuable time to bond with his son.
