The objective of RVIIC, is to investigate each of the Internet Service Providers in town (Comcast, Frontier, AT&T, etc.) and to find more reliable solutions. In each case the challenge for providers was simple—there were not enough people in our town to make it financially viable.

Internet Planet, operating out of Vacaville, was the only provider offering a high-bandwidth option, but it was only available within Trilogy. Leon notes that they are currently working on setting up antennas for Homecoming and downtown.

Ryan Reeves of Comcast, an Area Sales Manager, recognizes the frustration that we've experienced, and excitedly announces that faster speeds are around the corner. Their limitation has been the size of the pipe into our town, and they have finally drawn in fiber, which should increase speeds exponentially. To date, we have not only had slower speeds, but were not offered all the services that other communities enjoyed.

Once the switch is flipped, he and other representatives will be available in town to support Comcast ramping-up. Based on our service plan, we could see speeds up to IGB. We have not been receiving better than 12 MBS. Get your HD TVs ready for the changeover!
