Fire Truck Delivery To Guatemala

Clarksburg and Rio Vista Rotary are teaming up with the Montezuma Fire Department to give a reconditioned Fire Engine to the Volcano Victims of Guatemala, Mexico. The volcano, located about 30 miles from Guatemala city, erupted without warning on June 3, 2018, killing over 300 victims and destroying their homes.

With the hope of quicker response times in the event of another disaster, the Clarksburg Rotary Club, the Rio Vista Rotary Club plus Club Rotario Ciudad de Guatemala are working together to raise an additional \$20,000 to purchase and transport this fire truck from the Montezuma Fire District. The truck will go to the 9th volunteer department in Escuintla, Guatemala, located in the heart of the area affected by the volcano tragedy.

About \$5,000. has been raised to date. Another \$15,000. will be needed to be able to deliver the truck to Guatemala in late October. Other equipment has already been delivered as shown on page 2.

Mosquito Man To The Rescue





Waite Colbaugh, Biologist at the Solano County Mosquito Abatement District Speaks

Mosquito Season is here and we get valuable tips on how to protect ourselves. Mosquitoes in Solano County are capable of transmitting diseases, such as the West Nile Virus. Protect Yourself By:

DRAIN any standing water that may produce mosquitoes.

DRESS in long sleeves, long pants, and light-colored clothing.

DEFEND yourself, properly apply an approved repellent, such as DEET, picaridin, IR3535 or oil of lemon-eucalyptus.

DAWN & DUSK are times to avoid being outside.

DOOR and window screens should be in good working condition.

Protect yourself and pets by looking around your home for any standing water that has accumulated and is likely to breed mosquitoes. Be sure to drain and dump water from buckets, cans, toys, tires, containers, wheel barrows, leaky faucets/sprinklers, flower pots, ornamental ponds and clogged rain gutters.
