

Camp for Subsections. Ed. Edwin is pleased to report that both girls and boys have advanced—this is a big deal!




Tom and Lee are summoned to the front, by acting Pres. Dan, to spin the wheel.

RVPD: Taking Care of Business

Three new officers are in training, and all should be activated by mid-December. Also, there will be a vacancy, due to a promotion. Once filled, the force will be 100% staffed.

They are forging forward with their new station that will be located at Church road. It will be combined with the fire department. Four architectural firms will give presentations on November 20, and by March 2019 they expect final plans. The station should break ground in 2021. Their existing station will become occupied by Public Works, Planning and the Building Departments. This should coincide nicely with our growing population, which could go from 10,500 to 20,000 in the next

five years.

Homeless and transients are on the rise, as is the case for every city and county.
Unfortunately, a recent California Supreme Court ruling prohibits police from citing people for camping, unless police can prove that there is a bed available in a shelter nearby.
