

Linda's a grandma, again; her son & wife adopt two girls, 4 & 7 years old. She gives \$40, even though she's wearing red.


Jim Nordin visits Australia, but doesn't bring any Rotary Club flags back. He pays \$100 toward PHF.

#### Program

Pres. Jim presents fellow Rotarian, Wayne Woodward, who speaks about CA water issues. Wayne, who owns and operates a drilling business, answers the

question, "Is there a drought in CA?" He not only says there's a drought, but he shows us eye-popping evidence of the severe water shortage problems that CA is facing. It is quite obvious that these problems are not

new; they've just been exacerbated by the recent drought. Some reservoirs in our state currently look like there's enough water, and some look like they're about dry. But, photos of our snow pack over the past 4 years reveal a diminishing amount of snow, with this year's snow pack being 5% of normal. The snow is necessary to refill the reservoirs.

Wayne presents a pictorial view of our state's entire water system, describing both surface water and ground water. We're draining our aquifers bone dry. Salt water incursion into the delta is rapidly advancing as we draw water out. The C&H plant located near the entrance to the delta used to draw fresh water from the Carquinez Straights to process sugar in 1928.

Recently, however, the salt water reached the Antioch bridge.

To block the incursion of the salt water, a temporary dam will be placed at False River, May 8, with dams at Steamboat and Sutter Sloughs slated for later. Using maps, charts, and photos, and drawing from his own experience drilling wells in CA, Wayne presents a compelling story of the many problems that are occurring as a result of the depletion of our aquifers. The land is subsiding as water is removed and not replaced. Salt water from our rivers may irreversibly contaminate the aquifers.
