

Lee introduces Tim Chapa, our city manager, who's been on board about 8 months.

Tim's spent about 20 years working for public agencies, mostly in the central valley. Rio Vista is the second city where he's been the city manager. He's a Stanford grad and earned a post graduate MBA from Santa Clara.

Tim's goals are to achieve stability in our city government, transparency in city operations and improvment in customer service. He discusses the city's financial stability, showing how we can meet short term budgetary demands, and he proposes necessary adjustments to maintain a future balanced budget.

Tim was impressed with his welcome to our city. He appreciates all of the community support he received both before and after he arrived. He especially likes the enthu-

siasm and positive support from Rio Vision, as they take on large and small issues.

Tim gives an update on city projects, saying that today we are enjoying the results of work that was started 2 or 3 years ago. Future projects include streaming council meetings on the web, so that even those without Comcast can view and replay them. Also, we'll recruit a new finance mgr., planning mgr., transit mgr. & fire chief.

He discusses city finances in detail, mentioning possible ways to raise funds, the well #10 arsenic filter (it'll be back on line next month,) the bridge to Logan promenade, Hwy 12-Church Rd. reallignment and widening from Church Rd. to Drouin Dr. Mel asks about bike route to connect Homecoming to town. Rio Vision's working on it.
