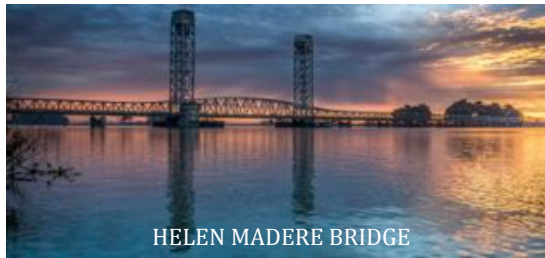

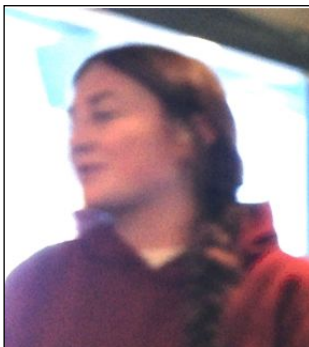
The RVHS Yearbook will be in the black, this year!
