

Jim McCracken introduces our keynote speaker, Skip Thomson, 5th District Solano County Supervisor, noting that Rio Vista is part of the 5th District.

Skip discusses county finances, our local Veterans Hall and the effects of Proposition 47.

Skip notes that since he last addressed our group, the county has morphed from

being \$50 million in debt to having \$30M in reserves. He adds that our unemployment rate has diminished, while the tax roll is up \$2.3 billion, due to property reassessment.

Skip reveals that the August earthquake caused \$2M of damage to public buildings in Vallejo. He says CalPERS is a major liability for the County that will double from last year's \$9M by 2021.

He says EPA comments set the governor's pet twin tunnel project back.

Chief Greg gives us a perspective from law enforcement on the problems that will result from passage of Prop. 47. Jim Lira explains the problems that his business is already experiencing from it's passage. Dan explains that there will be fewer prisoners to help fight wildfires. Evidently, passage of the measure was facilitated by the low voter turnout at our recent election.

Skip says that the Veterans Hall needs lots of work. He is committed to restoring it, but it may take a budget augmentation (maybe \$200,000) next year to do it.
