Bonnie tells of a trip she made with Rotaplast in 2010 to El Salvador with Rotarian surgeons to repair cleft lips and palates. She belonged to a quilt guild that made 128 beautifully colored quilts to take with her. These quilts were used to keep patients warm during and after surgery, and they were given to the grateful patients following the procedures.
