drives it. She's too old, but Jim will make an exception.

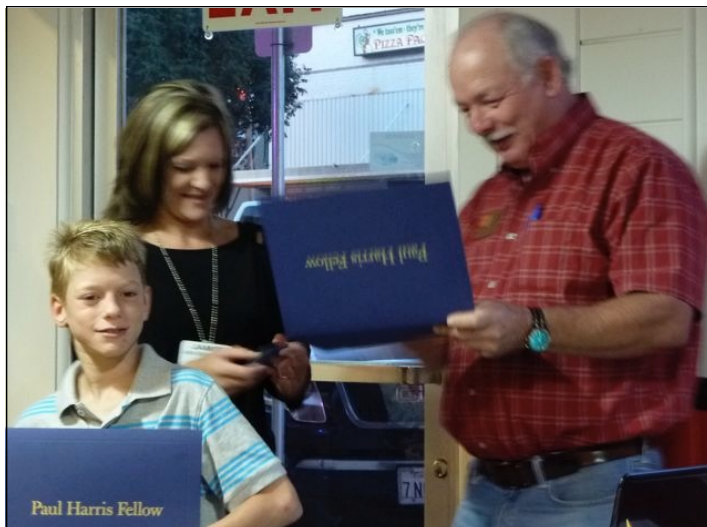
New facade for Lira's
